

I owe you my full honesty and presence in this time, my full courage in naming exactly what we are going through, even though that it is hard. To pretend that things will be the same or that I'll still see you is simply to be in denial about this loss, and to want it not to be. Together, we must simply name what is, and feel it, and be with one another. And all of us shall go on to good and bright tomorrows, with new people and ideas that will bring new challenge and change and growth. Such things are hard, but necessary.

So blessings to each one of you! I look forward to talking with you. I care about you all so deeply, and want only the best for everyone at SACC! Let us enter into this time of passage together, with open eyes and hearts, and see what God has in store for us.

TRANSITION UP-DATE FROM THE BOARD

The Board met on December 27 with Rev. Kelly Gallagher, UCC Associate Conference Minister, to discern our journey forward. Although the Board will be coordinating things to start, everyone can be involved in this transition time. We will surely need everyone to make the journey more meaningful.

The Board will be putting together an Interim Minister Profile in the next week or so. This will be given out to potential Interim Ministers who might be a good fit our congregation. We will then conduct interviews and choose one. Interim Ministers are trained for this time in a church's life and will surely be a

great asset.

There may be two or three weeks in between having Katrina leave and when the Interim Minister starts. This few week buffer is intentional, to give us a short period to catch breath. We are working on how to handle this short period. There are many options available to us, and we will let you know as soon as that is worked out.

On Katrina's last Sunday, February 7th (mark your calendars!), Rev. Kelly Gallagher will return to lead a "Liturgy of Farewell" to express gratitude, offer encouragement and release Katrina.

After securing an Interim Minister, the Board will be forming a Search Committee. The members of the committee should reflect the diversity of the church, i.e., gender, age, long time members and newer members, as well as persons with involvement in varied aspects of church life. (We have already had some volunteers for babysitters for Search Committee members if needed.) We will let you know when the process for nomination to the Search Committee has begun.

In the meantime, let us enjoy this precious time we have with Katrina. And remember that it's okay to grieve, and at the same time, it's also okay to have hope for our church's new journey!


